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New look at HIE may change meaningful use
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The Office of the National Coordinator for Health Information Technology is seeking public comment on a call from the President's Council of Advisors on Science and Technology to rapidly reworking how health information is exchanged. In particular, ONC seeks comment on how a quick transition in HIE policies and technologies would affect Stage 2 meaningful use criteria. 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White House calls for health data exchange standards
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The White House has called for a "universal exchange language" to enable health care providers to share health information in real time in order to modernize and coordinate diagnosis and treatment while incorporating privacy and security of personal data. To accomplish that, a White House report says the Office of the National Coordinator for Health IT and the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services should develop the technical definitions and descriptions for the standard language and include them in requirements for meaningful use of electronic health records in 2013 and 2015. State Department aims to install EHRs in health units worldwide
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The Department of State plans to implement an electronic health record system in its medical offices across the world to improve care quality and efficiency, according to an announcement published on the Federal Business Opportunities website, Government Health IT reports. The EHR system would be used in health units of varying sizes at U.S. embassies and consulates in 170 countries. About 50,000 federal and diplomatic employees and their families receive health care through the department. [MORE](#)
