



New MyIHMM Feature Streamlines Recertification

Ames, IA (April 20, 2018) – If you are a CHMM, CHMP or CDGP, you know that every five years you need to submit a recertification application to IHMM to demonstrate that you have remained active in the profession and obtained enough professional development. I’m not going to lie, this can really be a chore, especially if you are not the best at keeping records. You could end up spending several hours entering all your data with a deadline breathing down your neck.

IHMM has made some nice improvements to the MyIHMM web portal in recent months. It is now possible for you to log your certification maintenance points (CMPs) as you go. Just log into MyIHMM and start a recertification application. Then log your CMPs each time you participate in a professional development activity. I tried this out the other day and it worked slick. When you return to MyIHMM your active application has a “pending” status. Just open it, add your CMPs and log out. The pending application will be there next time you return to update it. After five years, you will have a complete application - just press submit.

If you maintain other certifications, like CSP or CIH, you may contact the certifying body and request to synchronize your recertification schedules with the IHMM. If you are a CSP, when you have completed recertification with IHMM, you simply forward your recertification letter to BCSP and you are done recertifying with them too.
