Curriculum design and implementation is one of Amelia's passions within Standardized Patient methodology. She has served on the Educational Content Committee since 2012 and served as chair of the Core Curriculum Sub-Committee since 2013. She is incredibly excited about the opportunity to serve as Chair.

Since 2007, Amelia has presented works on SP methodology in the United States at the annual conferences of the Association of Standardized Patient Educators (ASPE), the Association for Medical Education in Europe (AMEE), the Society in Europe for Simulation Applied to Medicine (SESAM), the International Meeting for Simulation in Healthcare (IMSH) and ModSim World.
