Workshop focus

Using a trauma-informed attachment based perspective, Joanne and Michelle will help participants conceptualize their clients, weave in their observations, and most importantly, formulate an intervention model. Using Circle of Security as a basis for this understanding, and then applying it to not just children, but clients of all ages, we can move the attachment lens to understand motivations behind behaviours and how to work to become effective treatment providers.

Michelle Maclsaac MSW, RSW is a clinical social worker with more than 17 years of practice. She has worked with children, adults, couples, and families in diverse settings including Early Intervention, the Canadian Armed Forces, IWK Health Centre and non-profit clinical settings. Her areas of specialization are trauma (PTSD and developmental trauma), disabilities (Autism and ADHD) and anxiety/depression. Michelle's training has included CBT, EMDR, Play Therapy (Theraplay), and Circle of Security.

Joanne Brown, BA, BSW, RSW is a clinical social worker with 30 years' experience servicing families who are experiencing difficulties parenting, who are involved with child welfare, who are parenting alone, and who have accompanying mental health concerns. Joanne has been the co-chair of the Attachment Network of Manitoba for 15 years (www.attachmentnetwork.ca) and has specialized her trainings in Circle of Security, Connect, Strange Situation Coding, and Theraplay. She works at the New Directions Parenting Centre in Winnipeg where she provides therapy to parents and families, and is a consultant to daycares and schools regarding confusing and often challenging behaviours in children.
